Organising Authority

Rules

The Regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the 2025 – 2028 *Racing Rules of Sailing*.

Entries and Eligibility

All yachts entering the Regatta should hold a current FYCA handicap or must accept a trial handicap allocated by the Regatta Committee.

The regatta is for Division 2 Yachts of handicap 975 and above including Restricted Sail (Restricted yachts are not permitted to fly spinnakers, cruising chutes or twin headsails, but may pole out headsails). Boat handicaps are those published currently by the FYCA for 2025. The Race Committee reserves the right to merge classes or starts should this prove necessary. FYCA Safety Regulations Cat 4R shall apply. Full details of Cat 4R Regulations can be found at

Entry/Registration

Yachts wishing to enter the regatta must register on each day as detailed below:

All boats **must register** on Saturday the 26th of July and Sunday 27th July either in person at the Forth Cruising Club race box or using VHF to the Starters hut, call Sign 'Forth Cruising Club' on VHF Ch.M1/37 between 14.25 and 14.45 BST on Saturday and 15.00 and 15.30 BST on Sunday.

Please give yacht name and sail number along with declaring whether you will be racing restricted sail or using a spinnaker.

Race Area

The main race area is the arena between the Forth Road Bridge to the east and Kincardine Bridge to the west, giving due regard to any restrictions imposed via current Notices to Mariners

Sailing Instructions

Sailing Instructions and courses will be published at least 2 days before the event and will be made available on the FCC website.

It is recommended that competing boats be familiar with these before the event.

Schedule

Saturday:

One race is scheduled for Division two yachts in this Regatta, start scheduled for 15.00 BST.

Sunday:

One race is scheduled for Division two yachts in this Regatta, start scheduled for 15.45 BST.

Disclaimer of Liability

Competitors participate in the Regatta entirely at their own risk. See Part 1 Fundamental Rules, Racing Rules of Sailing. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, prior to, during or after the Regatta.

A boat is entirely responsible for her own safety whether afloat or ashore. Nothing, whether in the Notice of Race, the Sailing Instructions or anywhere else, reduces this responsibility. It is for the boat to decide whether she is fit to sail in the conditions in which she will find herself. By going to sea, the boat confirms that she is fit for those conditions and her crew is competent to sail and compete in them.

Nothing done by the organisers can reduce the responsibility of the boat nor will it make the Organisers responsible for any loss, damage, death or personal injury, however it may have occurred, as a result of the boat taking part in the racing. The organisers encompass everyone helping to run the race and the event, and include the organising authority, the race committee, and the race officer.

Insurance

Each participating yacht shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £2,000,000.

Berthing

Free of charge drying moorings will be available overnight on Friday 25th, Saturday 26th and Sunday the 27th of July.

The clubhouse will be open after racing both on Saturday and Sunday.

Prize giving will take place on Sunday at the Clubhouse as soon as practicable after completion of racing.
